Focus on the Friends

Friends of Beebe have completed an exercise to establish the key tenets of our organization. In each newsletter we will highlight a different aspect of our organization.

Our second area of focus is to promote the library and its offerings throughout the community. We do this by:

- 1)** Highlighting library programs in our newsletter. As part of this we recruit volunteers to write articles for the newsletter, ask library leadership for suggestions as to programs they would like to promote, obtain suggestions for articles related to programs from the Board and newsletter volunteers, include at least one article in each newsletter that highlights programs or items that the Friends pay for, and obtain photos of events, programs, and the book sale to include in the newsletter.
- 2)** Promoting library programs via social media. This involves recruiting and assigning volunteers to create and manage postings to Board-approved social media platforms, posting information about library programs on said platforms, encouraging member feedback regarding our postings, and encouraging our members to share our social media postings.
- 3)** Promoting the library one on one, including at Town and Friends events. This includes participating in events such as Town Day and Wakefield 101, encouraging attendees to obtain a library card if they do not already have one, promoting library programs to attendees, and promoting library programs and services to others in the community, such as at the senior center and when doing book pickups.
- 4)** Promoting literacy in the community. We do this by providing free books at the Festival by the Lake, Farmers Market, Town Day, and other

events, as well as to teachers, charities, and other programs/organizations including the senior center and local groups for distribution at community dinners. In addition, it is part of our plan to hold literacy-related events such as book swaps, a teddy bear picnic, and book promotion events.

Friends of Beebe looking for Newsletter Editor

The newsletter is an important communication tool for any non-profit organization to stay in touch with membership to share past events and successes as well as promote upcoming plans and goals.

A newsletter editor is a person who enjoys working and coordinating with other content creators to gather submissions in a timely fashion and review/edit the articles as needed. The Editor will plan out the broad general goals for each issue during the year and attend monthly meetings or periodically check in with the Board to stay in sync.

The second part is layout and production of the newsletter and coordinating the dissemination of the newsletter primarily via email with a small print mailing by member request.

If you have skills in both areas, wonderful! Otherwise the position can be split into the content piece and the layout/printing piece. Past volunteers are on hand to help you get started. This is a great small way to get to know the Friends of Beebe Library better. It is a fun collegial group that needs many helping hands!

In 2025 a carefully collated DVD collection was donated and proved to have wide appeal. Although we do not generally accept DVDs, this may be an occasional feature. We expanded the Kids' section to include picture books, chapter books, activity and coloring books, in addition to board books.

Where else can you buy a recent Best Seller for \$2? Buzz Books that find their way to us make up a large portion of the fiction shelves.

There is now a non-fiction shelf dedicated to books of LOCAL INTEREST, from Wakefield and the surrounding area to Boston and New England.

In 2026 we plan to have an ongoing shelf of books that celebrates “250 Years of Independence (1776 – 2026).” As books become available, we will continue to stock the collection.

The books on offer at EBS are selected from donations and book drops held during the year. We choose books in excellent condition and try to target a wide variety of interests.

Located at the Circulation Desk, Beebe Honey is locally harvested just a few towns over at Crystal Bee Supply in Peabody, Mass. Crystal Bee Supply is a family-owned beekeeping store that has been managing up to 200 hives and selling beekeeping equipment since 1993.

One of the best parts about buying local honey? You're supporting both small businesses and native pollinator species!

Honey can also contribute to a number of health benefits. For instance, honey can aid with digestion and provide helpful antioxidants, and can be a great natural sugar in place of artificial sweeteners. Not to mention that honey can be an excellent natural remedy for coughs and other cold/allergy symptoms.

As for supporting the Beebe Library, 100% of honey sales go towards supporting the Beebe's programming and services, from Plaza Jazz to virtual author talks to library staples like the virtual meeting booths and pay phone.


